## Who we are:

Ranch Ehrlo Society is a non-profit, charitable organization governed by a board of directors, which operates residential, clinical, community, and educational programs across the province. In addition to vocational, recreational, affordable housing, childcare, and counselling services in the community, Ranch Ehrlo operates the largest residential treatment program in the province serving over 250 youth and employing over 700 staff.

Programs are located at the main campus outside of Pilot Butte, in the City of Regina, in the City of Prince Albert, at the Buckland campus north of Prince Albert, and at the Corman Park campus outside the City of Saskatoon.

The Ranch Ehrlo Society is a sustaining member of the Child Welfare League of Canada and is accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA).



## Mission and philosophy:

The mission of the Ranch Ehrlo Society is to provide a continuum of quality preventative, restorative, and advocacy services, promoting the well-being of individuals, families, and communities through the elimination of abuse, neglect, addictions, and violence, in Saskatchewan and beyond.

The Ranch takes a holistic and social nourishment approach to all its programs and services. The Ranch has four cornerstones to its treatment process: 1) treatment, 2) recreation, 3) education, and 4) work.

A primary goal of the Ranch is advocacy for children, youth, and families. We treat each individual uniquely, with respect, dignity, compassion, and without prejudice or discrimination.

## Who we serve:

In its residential programming, the Ranch serves three age groups of young people including 12 years of age and under, 13 to 18 years of age, and over 18 years of age who are experiencing a range of social, psychological, behavioural and cognitive difficulties.

Through all five of its community-based programs, the Ranch provides services to a wide variety of people in the community. These include families, adults, youth, and children.

We serve families through our family reunification, intensive family preservation, and treatment foster care programs.
