The Learning Centre is a special education program designed for adults with developmental disabilities and sensory needs. It provides individualized community-based services that will maximize development, community inclusion, independence, and the client's contribution to the society in which they live. The participants will be challenged to achieve their full potential for independence, productivity, right to enjoy life, and inclusion in the community.



# Program goal

The Learning Centre is designed to meet the needs of participants who have severe to moderate developmental disabilities. Participants are 17 years or older. Programming involves ongoing social and life skills development, simple vocational training through constant, repetitive routines developed to meet the participants' individualized needs. Through collaboration with residents, employers, community, and staff the program goal is to offer a high quality of work life for the participants.

# **Pre-vocational training**

Within the first month of enrollment at the Learning Centre, a detailed Individual Program Plan is developed for each participant. This plan will include communication, social and pre-vocational goals, and expected outcomes, using a variety of resources to offer a sense of accomplishment.
